



JEWELS WORTH MILLIONS. The Russian crown jewels—the priceless heirlooms of the Romanoffs with histories more romantic than the Arabian Nights' tales—on display in Moscow and soon to be disposed of by the Soviet Treasury to aid in the stabilization of the ruble. In the center is the Imperial Russian Crown weighing over four pounds and containing the world's largest ruby together with fifty thirty-karat diamonds, twenty-one forty-

five karat diamonds and hundreds of smaller ones. Beneath the crown is a golden scepter containing the fabled Orloff diamond. Other treasures in this sparkling array include the famous thousand-year-old Shah diamond, as large as an apple; a 200-karat sapphire, the crown with 1933 diamonds, a chain of emeralds of 270 karats, A Ural aquamarine of 1,000 karats and a lavalliere of pearls and diamonds including 225 pearls of 250 karats. *Wide World*
